The Blueprint Laid Down

Genesis 1 – 2 · Apostle Tommy E. Quick

Genesis 1:1 – 2:25 · Panorama 1 of 15

Episode length: ~20 minutes

One-sentence promise: "Before the breach, before the flood, before the covenant cut — God laid the blueprint. Tonight we read that blueprint as a map."

Cold open (00:00 – 01:00)

[OPEN][THEME]

HOST: In the beginning, God created the heaven and the earth. Seven words. Ten syllables. And in those seven words the entire architecture of the Bible is already in place. Welcome to the CFADD Panorama Podcast. I am Apostle Tommy E. Quick. This season we are walking the Torah — Genesis to the wilderness journey — using fifteen Panoramas that map the whole story on one page each. Tonight we open with Panorama 1: Blueprint Laid Down.

[PAUSE]

[MAP] Before we go further — open Panorama 1. If you do not have it yet, pause the audio, go to cfadd.org/pentateuch, download the booklet, and come back. I am about to walk you through the eight zones of the page, and the page itself is your map. [THEME OUT]

Zone 1 — Banner Theme (01:00 – 02:00)

[ZONE 1]

HOST: The banner at the top of your Panorama reads — Blueprint Laid Down. Subtitle: The original architecture of creation, marriage, and dominion. That is the theme of these two chapters. Not a poem about origins. A blueprint. The word blueprint matters. Architects do not begin with materials. They begin with drawings. Genesis 1 and 2 is God's drawing — and every page of Scripture that follows is the construction.

Zone 2 — Macro Position (02:00 – 04:00)

[ZONE 2]

HOST: Look at the Macro Position box just below the banner. This is the most important sentence on the page. It tells you where this section sits in the entire Restoration storyline.

The macro reads: This is the Blueprint stage of the Pentateuch. Before there is a breach, there is a building. Before there is a flood, there is a foundation. Before there is a Sinai, there is a Sabbath. Most of us have been taught Genesis 1 as a debate about how the world began. The Panorama teaches it as a blueprint — every later breach, every later restoration, every later covenant is measured against what God put on the page in the first seven days.

[SHIFT] Hear me — if you do not have a clear blueprint, you will not know when something is broken. The reason our culture cannot name a destructive decision is because it has lost the blueprint. Genesis 1 is not the question. Genesis 1 is the answer key.

Zone 3 — Color-Coded Outline Bar (04:00 – 06:30)

[ZONE 3]

HOST: Now look at the outline bar across the middle of the page. Six chips. Walk them with me left to right.

Chip 1 — Days 1–3 · Forming. God separates light from darkness, water from sky, land from sea. He is making room.

Chip 2 — Days 4–6 · Filling. Sun, moon, stars. Fish, birds, animals. Humanity. He is making occupants for the rooms He just made.

Chip 3 — Day 7 · Sabbath. Rest. Not because God is tired. Because the house is finished and He is moving in.

Chip 4 — Eden. A garden planted eastward in Eden. The first sanctuary.

Chip 5 — The Image. Male and female He created them. The image of God carried in two — not one. The blueprint of marriage.

Chip 6 — Dominion. Be fruitful, multiply, replenish, subdue, have dominion. The first commission.

[SHIFT] Notice the rhythm — Form, then Fill. Rest. Then Garden, Image, Dominion. The page is showing you that God builds the world the way an architect builds a house: foundation first, occupancy second, sabbath third, and only then are the keys handed to humanity.

Zone 4 — Structural Flow (06:30 – 09:00)

[ZONE 4]

HOST: Zone 4, on the left side of the page, walks the Structural Flow — how the text moves.

- The Spirit hovers over the waters. The mood is brooding.
- God speaks. Light comes. The mood becomes architectural.
- Six days of creating, each ending with it was good.
- The seventh day ends with it was very good — and He rested.
- Then Genesis 2 zooms in. Same story, second focus. The garden. The man. The naming of the animals. The first surgery — a rib taken, a bride built.
- The chapter ends naked and unashamed. Not a scandal. A blueprint.

[PAUSE]

The structural flow tells you the Bible's very first move is not law, not sacrifice, not even worship. It is architecture and intimacy. Architecture in chapter 1. Intimacy in chapter 2. That order matters. Every household I have ever walked with that lost its intimacy first lost its architecture.

Zone 5 — Thematic Shifts (09:00 – 11:00)

[ZONE 5][SHIFT]

HOST: On the right side of the page, four Thematic Shifts. Watch the mode change with me.

Shift 1 — Chaos to Cosmos. The earth was without form and void. By day six it is ordered, named, populated. God's first work is bringing order out of formless waste. Hold that — it is what He still does for households.

Shift 2 — Speaking to Forming. Chapters 1 and 2 are different. In chapter 1 God says and it is. In chapter 2 God forms with His hands and breathes into the man. The same God who can speak a galaxy into being chose to hand-make a human.

Shift 3 — Alone to Together. It is not good that the man should be alone. The only thing in all of creation God calls not good before the fall is isolation. The blueprint is communal.

Shift 4 — Subdue to Steward. The dominion mandate is not exploitation. The man is placed in the garden to dress it and to keep it — the same verbs the Levites will later use for tabernacle service. Dominion is priestly stewardship, not consumption.

Zone 6 — Literary Divisions (11:00 – 12:00)

[ZONE 6]

HOST: Zone 6 names the literary units. Two of them.

- Genesis 1:1 – 2:3 — The seven-day creation account. Cosmic in scope, liturgical in shape.
- Genesis 2:4 – 2:25 — The garden account. Intimate in scope, marital in shape.

One book. Two zoom levels. Both authoritative. The Panorama refuses to make you choose between them.

Zone 7 — Ministry Layer (12:00 – 16:30)

[ZONE 7][MINISTRY]

HOST: Now the heart of the page — the six-pillar Ministry Layer. This is where every section of every Panorama lands on the household and the culture. Six pillars, every time.

Pillar 1 — Doctrine in the Text. God is Creator. Before He is anything else to us — Savior, Father, Judge, King — He is the One who made. Lose that doctrine and every other doctrine drifts.

Pillar 2 — Family Principle. Marriage is older than sin, older than law, older than the nation. Male and female created He them is in chapter 1. The breach is in chapter 3. The blueprint of the household is two chapters older than the first sin.

Pillar 3 — Kingdom Principle. Dominion was given to a married couple under God. Not to a government. Not to an empire. A family was the first administration. Our advocacy work begins here.

Pillar 4 — Cultural Application. Where a culture loses the blueprint, every redefinition becomes possible — of marriage, of family, of personhood, of work, of rest. The Panorama puts the blueprint back on the table.

Pillar 5 — Prayer Declaration. Lord, restore the blueprint over my household. Make our rooms ordered. Fill them with Your image. Teach us Sabbath before we teach our children dominion. Pray that this week.

Pillar 6 — Rebuilder's Charge. Rebuilders do not start with the breach. Rebuilders start with the blueprint. You cannot fix what you have not first drawn. This week, draw your household's blueprint — write down what your home is supposed to look like before you write down what is broken.

Zone 8 — Christward Trajectory (16:30 – 18:30)

[ZONE 8][CHRISTWARD]

HOST: The gold panel at the bottom of the page. Every Panorama ends here. Christ in the text.

Christ in Genesis 1 and 2. The Word that God speaks in chapter 1 is the Word who becomes flesh in John 1: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. Every "God said" in Genesis 1 is the voice of the Son. Colossians 1: by him were all things created. Hebrews 1: upholding all things by the word of his power. The Spirit that hovers over the waters in 1:2 will hover over a virgin in Luke 1 and over a baptism in Matthew 3. The man Adam is called by Paul a figure of him that was to come — the Last Adam. The garden of Eden anticipates the garden of Gethsemane and the garden of the empty tomb. The first marriage anticipates the marriage of the Lamb. Christ is not added to Genesis 1. Christ is in Genesis 1.

[PAUSE]

Close and CTA (18:30 – 20:00)

[CTA]

HOST: Friends, that is Panorama 1. The blueprint laid down. Three things before we close.

One. If you have not yet downloaded the Panorama for tonight, do it now — cfadd.org/pentateuch. Save it to your phone. Look at it once a day this week.
